IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS

Trash:

Garbage is picked up on Thursdays.

If a national holiday falls on a weekday, trash will be picked up the following day.

Signs will be posted throughout The Village. Please use plastic bags **ONLY**, or approved rubbish containers (40 lb. weight limit).

DO NOT use cardboard boxes as rubbish containers. Cardboard should be broken down and placed in recycle containers. Styrofoam should be placed in a trash container, not in recycle containers.

Contractors are responsible for removing their work.

Contractors are **NOT** to leave any MASONRY, CONCRETE, or BUILDING MATERIALS on the tree lawns.

Bulk Pickup:

A Flyer describing the dos and don'ts of bulk pickup will be distributed, and signs will be posted throughout the Village.

Brush Guidelines:

All brushes must be placed in trash containers or bundled and tied.

Snow Removal:

DO NOT park on Village streets when there is a snow event exceeding 2 inches. This helps The Village remove snow more efficiently. **DO NOT** block sidewalks with snow from driveways. This helps service personnel to effectively clear the sidewalks.

DEPARTMENT UPDATES

As we enter the winter months, please remember to implement safe practices in and around your place of residence.

According to the National Fire Protection Association, space heaters and other heating equipment are one of the leading causes of home fire deaths. Fire departments respond to an estimated average of 44,210 fires involving heating equipment per year on average (see next page for more information).

Last month, we had the opportunity to participate in the yearly Thistledown Mudd Run. All of the money raised from the event will be donated to the North Randall Fire Department for equipment. We would like to thank Jack Thistledown and the team for all of their support this past year.

Recently, Mayor Smith and Village Council approved the purchase of two 2021 red fire response vehicles. One of these will replace our Fire Chiefs 2006 response vehicle, and the other vehicle will be for our shift officer to respond to certain emergencies as needed.

The vehicles are currently getting decaled, lights installed and lastly radio communications. Stay tuned for completion photos.

Portable Heater Fire Safety



Follow these portable heater tips to help prevent winter fires and to stay safe this winter season.

Place space heaters on a solid, flat surface. Keep them at least three feet from things that can burn.



Check your space heater for cracked or damaged cords and plugs. Plug space heaters directly into wall outlets, don't use an extension cord or power strip.

The Village of North Randall Fire Department has partnered with the American Red Cross to provide smoke detectors to Village residents. Any resident that does not have a working smoke detector in their home may apply.

To apply contact the American Red Cross Smoke Detector Hot-line at (216) 361-5535. Provide the requested information.

Once your information has been processed, the smoke detector(s) will be delivered to the North Randall Fire Department.

A representative from the FD will contact you to arrange a time for the FD to come out and install your detector(s).

All smoke detectors must be installed by NRRFD personnel.

NO EXCEPTIONS!

If you presently have a working smoke detector, please **DO NOT** order new ones. Due to recent supply issues, supplies are limited.
